1. Who are Roma?

4. Roma identity

- Roma means 'people' in Romanes language TRUE
- Roma are not a homogeneous group and do not have a single cultural identity -
- Roma communities have rich regional diverse cultures and traditions depending on where they live - TRUE
- All Roma women wear long skirts FALSE



5. Important dates

- On 8th April 1971 the Roma flag was adopted at the first Romani World Congress in London. This is known internationally as Roma Nation Day **TRUE**
- The flag colours represent Blue for the sky, Green for the land and the Red Wheel signifies movement and progress **TRUE**
- The month of June is known as Gypsy Roma Traveller History Month (GRTHM) in the UK **TRUE**
- On 2nd August 1944, 2987 Roma were killed in Auschwitz (a German Nazi Concentration Camp in Poland). This is known as Roma Genocide Remembrance Day and there is a memorial stone in Hyde Park - TRUE

6. Roma discrimination

- All Roma people steal FALSE
- Roma have a shared history of discrimination, persecution and exclusion TRUE
- Roma were an enslaved people, most notably in Romania where slavery was abolished in 1856 - TRUE
- Roma people were victims of the Second World War and over 500,000 Roma were killed **TRUE**

- Charlie Chaplin, actor and film-maker (1889-1977) TRUE
- Django Reinhardt, musician (1910-1953) TRUE
